Adele Little is the chapter's only remaining founding member and has been an active part of the organization since helping found the chapter on April 20, 1968. Her contributions to the community led to her being named as one of the Outstanding Women for Stanislaus County 2009, and the recipient of the Jean and Clyde Dunlap Award for her dedication and devotion to literacy-- an honor that is well-deserved. All Eta Mu sisters continue to benefit from her knowledge and guidance. To make this event even more meaningful, Adele donated her previous pins to the chapter, that they may be used to honor the commitment to DKG of others.

Greetings Sisters! Here are a few Legislative Updates ("Nonaca's News")

What's happening in the CA Legislature?

As of 9/24/23: The Legislature completed its work Thursday, September 14, 2023, and reconvenes on January 3, 2024. Below is the current status of the bills DKG California is monitoring. The Governor must act on bills on his desk by October 14, 2023. A final report will be provided by October 31, 2023. Current bill status report on the educational bills DKG CA is watching. **You can learn more about each bill by searching for the bill here

CA Senate Has a New President Pro Tempore

The next Senate President Pro Tempore will be <u>Sen. Mike McGuire</u> (D-Healdsburg). The date he will take over as President pro Tempore has yet-to-bedetermined in 2024. Current Senate President Pro Tempore Toni Atkins terms out of office next year. Expect to see change of committee chairpersons next year. This change represents a second shift of power in the Legislature this year. Assemblymember Robert Rivas (D-Hollister) is now Assembly Speaker. Assemblymember McGuire terms out in 2026. His primary interests are the environment and climate change. Please note he was a school board member and his wife is an elementary school principal.
