### **DECEMBER SPEAKER MEETING**



Eta Mu members and guests gathered at the home of Kay Anderson for the December meeting. They enjoyed an assortment of holiday cookies and cake served by Mary Lou Dieterich, Karen Harris, and Karen Moore.

Special guests for the evening included California State Organization 1st Vice President, Daphne Cagle and Area XVII Director Barbara Nash. They invited

members to attend the California State Organization Conference April 29, to May 1, 2016 in Fresno. Other guests included Sarah Mucha, a first year teacher and former student of Linda Chabas, and prospective member Heather Coons.



Special guest speaker, Lori Aderholt, from World Relief Modesto, a resettlement agency for refugees in Stanislaus County, informed members of the organizations efforts as well as partnerships with churches, individuals, and the community to assist refugees transitioning to their new life in the U.S. Mrs. Aderholt explained the rigorous screening that each refugee must pass before being admitted into the United States. She asked members to consider volunteering time to tutor newcomers or donations of supplies and household items to help settle the new families.

Jared Boxes and "no-sew" blankets were collected and Janice Freeman, Kathleen Heinzinger, Karen Harris, and Mary Lou Dieterich will distribute them to Doctors' Hospital, Modesto Gospel Mission and the Family Justice Center.

#### ETA MU AWARDS A GRANT-IN AID

Eta Mu awarded Sarah Mucha, a first year teacher at Central High School in Ceres, a Grant-in-Aid fellowship. Sarah Mucha is a graduate of Sonoma State University with a BA in Mathematics with a concentration in secondary education. She also received her credential from SSU. Her student teaching experience was at Napa High School. As an undergraduate at SSU, Sarah ran a Calculus 1 Workshop twice a week emphasizing Calculus 1 concepts.

Sarah went through Modesto City Schools where Linda Chrabas first encountered her at La Loma Junior High School in Grade 8. She went on to graduate from Thomas Downey High School. Beyond a monetary grant from Eta Mu, chapter member Linda Chrabas is offering support through actively volunteering to assist Sara who is a former student of hers. Chapters provide Grants-in-Aid to non-member women educators. This Grant-in-Aid encourages young educators through our financial support and interest in them.
