MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

Meet Mercedes Hart Advocate for English Learners



Mercedes, a native of Spain, studied Spanish composition, Latin translation, and math at Valencia University in Spain as a Spanish major. After coming to the United States, she studied at Modesto Junior College, then earned her Bilingual Teaching Credential at California State University, Stanislaus. While





teaching preschool, she also earned her MA degree in counseling.

Mercedes began her career as a bilingual teacher at a Head Start program. Over the years she taught pre-school, Kindergarten, 1st-2nd grade, and 7th-8th grade with an emphasis on English as a Second Language.

During her many years as a teacher, Mercedes advocated for English Language students and ESL programs. She pushed for the integration of ESL students into mainstream classes and had to fight against discriminatory practices and systems for resources for ESL students, at a time when ESL programs had not yet been developed. Though she officially "retired" in 1998, she continued to work for Ceres Unified School District at Mae Hensley Junior High for the next 7-8 years to help with ESL testing.

In 2003, in addition to public school teaching, Mercedes began an ESL community program with Lauren Willoughby to provide outreach by teaching non English speakers how to communicate in English at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Modesto, CA. Mercedes continues to meet with students of this program to this day and gains great joy in the progress that her students make, some of whom have gone on to gain their United States citizenship.

At age 92, she was told by her doctor she might have only 1-2 years to live. At her doctor's recommendation she had heart surgery inserting a valve into her heart allowing the blood to flow more freely to all parts of her body. Now she's feeling well and plans to continue tutoring English to Spanish speaking women once she can learn how to Zoom.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Hello Sisters,

I hope this finds you well with your home smelling of pumpkin spice and apple cider. Here are a few notes to keep in mind as we roll into election season:

- 1. The General Election is November 3, 2020.
- 2. Per the <u>Governor's Executive Order N-64-20</u>, all <u>registered voters will be mailed a vote-by-mail ballot</u> (I got mine this week. Have you checked your mailbox?)
- 3. Please review the table below for important election deadlines.

California Election Deadlines

Election Date	<u>Voter Registration</u>	<u>Vote-by-Mail</u> Ballot Request	Completed Ballots, Including Vote-by-Mail Ballots
November 3, 2020 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Presidential Primary Election	Online or Postmark by October 19, 2020 or You can "conditionally" register and vote at your county elections office after the 15-day voter registration deadline.	Must arrive by October 27, 2020	Personally delivered ballots: Must be delivered by close of polls on November 3, 2020; Mailed ballots: Must be postmarked on or before November 3, 2020, and received by your county elections office no later than November 20, 2020.

- 5. For information about dropbox locations, polling places, voter registration, and to check your voter status check out this website: https://www.sos.ca.gov/elections
- 6. Did you know that you can track your ballot? You can follow your ballot as it is mailed, received, and counted through this website: https://california.ballottrax.net/voter/
- 7. Most importantly, use your voice and vote!
